## DESCRIPTION

The online training will address the international framework on cybercrime and e-Evidence and its latest developments, with a special focus on the new EU e-evidence Legislative Package (Directive EU 2023/1544 and Regulation EU 2023/1543), as well as conflicts of jurisdiction and cross-border access to data, remote access to digital data, open-source evidence and judicial cooperation in criminal matters, including the EIO.

The online training will also showcase the IT decentralised system which will enable the digitalization of the judiciary authorities' requests to the internet service providers on cross-border e-evidence gathering, according to the new framework adopted by the Directive and the Regulation.

Judges and Prosecutors from all Member States will be involved in case-solving methodology inspired by real facts and involving both national laws and cross-border judicial cooperation.

By the end of the training, participants will be able to:

- Understand the international and EU legal framework, operational frameworks governing access to electronic evidence, and be able to apply cross-border cooperation tools effectively in line with the Evidence Regulation and other judicial tools;
- Identify challenges related to cloud services, big tech platforms, and data fragmentation (obtain evidence from internet);
- Be aware about digitalisation of justice and understand how to use the decentralised IT system related to the e-Evidence Regulation.
